

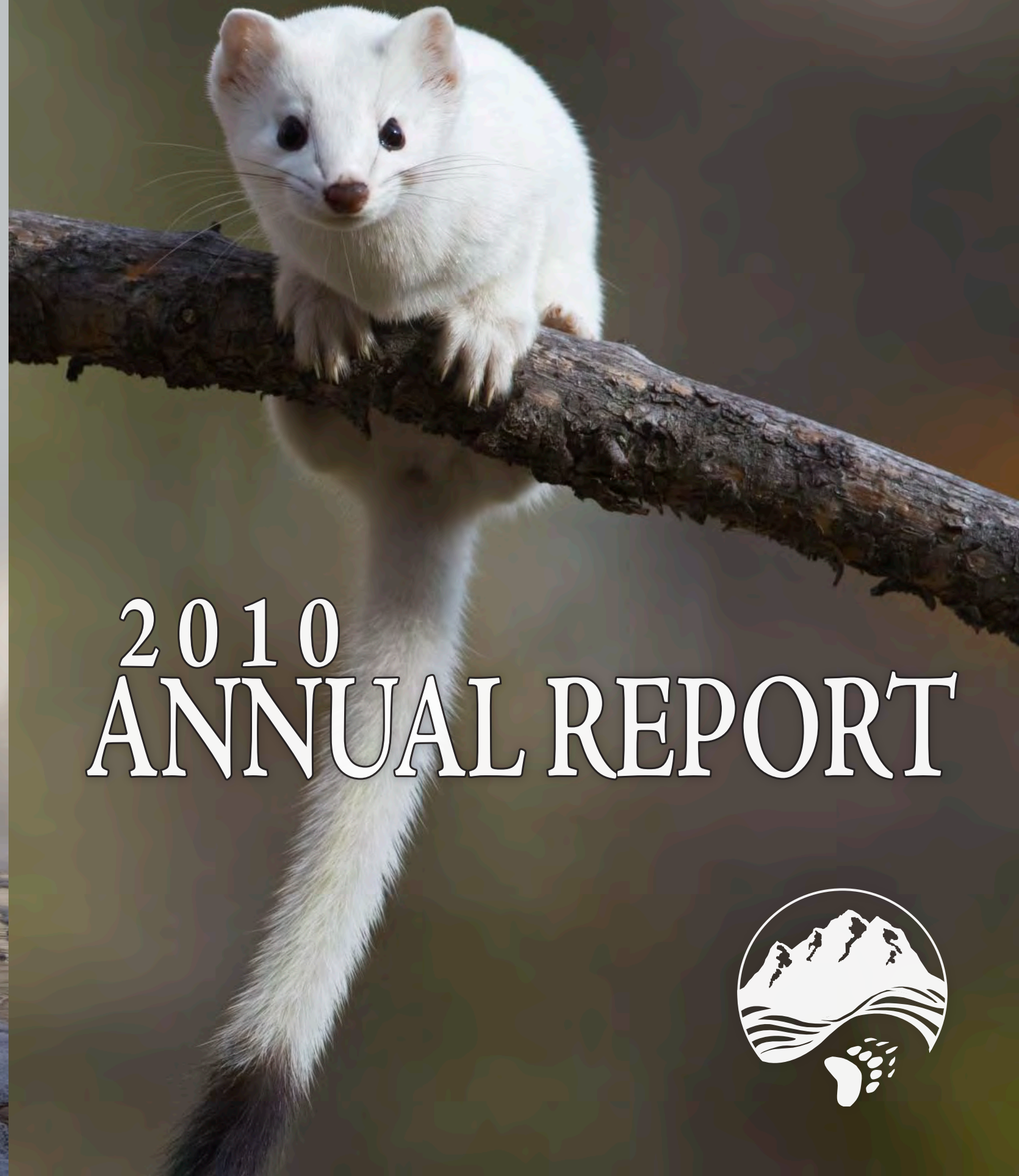

2009-10: Landmark year for GYE wildlife

Yellowstone National Park turned 138 years old in 2010, and among the many wonders of what is often described as “America’s greatest gift to the world”, perhaps this one speaks loudest:

Like a fine wine, Yellowstone is improving with age.

The park is improving in the spiritual sense, inasmuch as this incomparably wild place increasingly insulates us from the rapidly closing walls of “progress” around us. And Yellowstone is improving in the literal sense as well, due largely to the continuing dedication of the millions who — like yourself — cherish the last great intact temperate ecosystem on the planet.



trees and shrubs are undergoing a rebirth that in turn is helping to restore populations of songbirds, beaver and cutthroat trout.

This growing “natural regulation” is the result of a relatively new view of the park’s role in our culture. When once management philosophy was geared toward how the park can benefit humans, today it is more about how humans can benefit the park — which, ultimately, benefits the millions of humans who come to witness and experience the last great intact temperate ecosystem on the planet. This renaissance is epitomized by rules governing use of snowmobiles. Once plagued by the unfettered use of loud and smelly sleds that stressed wildlife and fouled the air, Yellowstone now receives modest traffic from cleaner and quieter sleds led by trained guides.

We have come a long way from the days when wolves and cougars were extirpated, nightly grizzly feasts at open dumps were viewed by tourists from bleachers, elk were routinely slaughtered to manage their prolific populations, and bison were fed in corrals at the Buffalo Ranch with hay grown and harvested in the Lamar Valley.

Yet our work is far from finished. If we think of the 20 million acres of Greater Yellowstone as a living, breathing organism, with the 2.2-million-acre park itself as its heart, the rivers and streams as the capillaries, and the wild country surrounding it as the lungs, then it’s clear that challenges and threats remain.

Here is a closer look at the issues we’re facing today — the issues where your continued support is so vital so that future generations may have the privilege of experiencing a Yellowstone that’s even more magical than the place we know today:

- ♦ **GRIZZLY BEARS:** GYC’s founding revolved around the grizzly bear, and the fight continues. Though populations have rebounded in the past 30 years, the bear’s future remains uncertain due to the loss of such food sources as the whitebark pine nut, cutthroat trout and Army cutworm moth. As some push for premature lifting of Endangered Species Act protections, we are expanding our efforts to protect the grizzly.

Building on success

While working to protect the lands, waters, and wildlife of our incomparable region for the past 28 years, the Greater Yellowstone Coalition has never had a permanent home.

Soon, thanks to the generosity of many dedicated and patient supporters, we will. A project seven years in the making will come to fruition late this autumn, when our Bozeman staff relocate to a LEED-certified, retrofitted seed warehouse on the east side of downtown.

The move will result in substantial short- and long-term cost savings for GYC, improve the working environment for staff, provide needed meeting space for regional conservation groups, and enhance the vibrancy of downtown Bozeman.

The purchase and renovation of this historic building to meet environmentally friendly standards has been accomplished without reallocating funds dedicated to our program work. In fact, the cost reductions associated with owning our own building will enable us to expand our conservation efforts in the region.



Most important, this project sends a clear signal that GYC is fundamentally strong and will be here to protect the integrity of one of the planet's last great temperate ecosystems for a long, long time.

Our move-in date is scheduled for sometime in December. Please watch your mail for more information regarding our *Building for the Future* campaign and how you can be involved. We welcome you to stop by, say hello and take a look around our new home.

Financial Summary: Fiscal Year 2010

On Sept. 30, 2010 we had:

- An asset balance of \$4.35 million in unrestricted or temporarily restricted funds; and
- A permanently restricted endowment fund of nearly \$2 million.

We had revenues¹ of \$2,571,009 and expenses were \$2,607,742.

Our revenue sources were:

- Individual supporters: \$1,412,804 (55%)
- Foundation grants: \$ 609,082 (24%)
- Other: \$ 549,123 (21%)
(events, interest, endowment earnings, etc.)

Expenses were for:

- Conservation programs: \$1,932,542 (74%)
- Administration: \$ 280,865 (11%)
- Fundraising: \$ 394,335 (15%)

We began 2010 by purchasing a building in Bozeman to serve as GYC's new headquarters. The investment is expected to save the organization significantly in rent over the long term. Renovations are under way, with a move date of late 2011.

¹ Revenue is income that is recognized in the year that the funds are pledged, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles for nonprofit organizations. Our 2010 income included \$450,000 in grant funds that do not appear as revenue on this page because they were pledged for 2010 in a prior year, and \$360,000 that appears as revenue in 2010 but is to be used in future years. 🐾

- ♦ **WOLVES:** One of the greatest success stories in American conservation is shifting as Montana and Idaho take over management of wolves. Sixteen years after reintroduction, nearly 1,700 roam the Northern Rockies. We will now be ever vigilant to ensure the states manage for healthy and enduring populations.
- ♦ **BISON:** Slowly but surely, we are moving toward a day when these wild remnants of the great plains and mountain bison are free to roam on appropriate public, private and tribal landscapes across Montana and the West. Already, for the first time in generations, Yellowstone bison are moving about the Gardiner Basin north of the park without fear of hazing or slaughter.
- ♦ **ABSAROKA-BEARTOOTH FRONT:** The Bureau of Land Management has released a plan that will determine how the Bighorn Basin is managed for the next two decades. We have a unique opportunity to protect valuable wildlife habitat while still allowing careful energy development. Paramount to this mission is withdrawing the wild Absaroka-Beartooth Front west of Cody, Wyo., one of the wildest and most wildlife-rich places outside of a national park in the Lower 48, from oil and gas drilling.
- ♦ **WYOMING RANGE:** The 2009 passage of the Wyoming Range Legacy Act withdrew 1.2 million acres of prime wildlife habitat and outdoor recreation lands from energy development. Still at risk, however, is the upper Hoback River region, where we continued to fight a proposal to drill 136 wells natural gas wells that would despoil critical wildlife habitat, threaten air quality in Jackson and potentially pollute this federally designated Wild & Scenic river's headwaters.
- ♦ **PHOSPHATE MINING:** Thanks to pressure from GYC and our members, phosphate-mining companies in Greater Yellowstone's southwest corner are adopting unprecedented quality-control

measures as they seek to build new mines. We continue to demand that the phosphate industry clean up its 17 federal Superfund sites in southeast Idaho.

- ♦ **FOREST JOBS & RECREATION ACT:** Sen. Jon Tester's made-in-Montana Forest Jobs & Recreation Act would establish wilderness in the state for the first time since 1983, create jobs restoring damaged forests, and protect critical migration habitat between Yellowstone Park and the wilds of central Idaho. We continue our efforts to help get this important bill passed.
- ♦ **GALLATIN CREST WILDERNESS STUDY AREA:** These uniquely wild 155,000 acres in Bozeman's backyard is the last unprotected country bordering Yellowstone National Park. GYC has played a major role in working with the Forest Service to produce a travel plan that protects this sensitive area.
- ♦ **CUTTHROAT TROUT:** This native fish, imperiled by shrinking habitat, is fighting for its very existence in Yellowstone Lake, where the illegal or accidental introduction of the voracious lake trout in the late 1980s is close to wiping out cutthroat populations. We are beginning to work with the Park Service on a project that would dramatically reduce this threat by identifying lake trout spawning beds.
- ♦ **CLIMATE CHANGE:** The proverbial elephant in Greater Yellowstone's living room is the effects of a rapidly changing climate on the region's lands, waters and wildlife. Models created by climate expert Dr. Healy Hamilton from the California Academy of Sciences show this region becoming an increasingly important refugia for wildlife in a warming world. As such, nearly every issue we address now has a climate component, and we are re-evaluating the size and scope of Greater Yellowstone based on what these models are telling us. 🐾
